



Disc Golf Course Rules



1. The Disc Golf Course is open sunrise to sunset.
2. BE EARTH CONSCIOUS--DON'T LITTER! Pick up trash, even if it isn't yours.
3. Disc golf is played like ball golf, using flying discs. One stroke is counted each time the disc is thrown, and when a penalty is incurred. The winner is the golfer with the lowest score.
4. Tee throws must be completed within the designated tee areas. Beginners should always use 'short' tees, when provided.
5. The player with the fewest strokes on the previous hole is first to tee off. After teeing off, the player whose disc is farthest from the hole always throws first.
6. Fairway throws must be made with the foot closest to the hole on the spot where the last throw came to rest. The other foot may be no closer to the hole than the foot on this lie.
7. A run-up and normal follow-through, after release, are allowed more than 10 meters from the hole. Inside 10 meters, a player may not step past his/her lie. 'Falling or jumping' putts are not allowed inside 10 meters.
8. A disc that comes to rest inside the disc pole hole basket or chains constitutes successful completion of that hole. A disc that comes to rest on top of the pole hole does NOT constitute a successful hole, or completion of that hole.
9. A disc that comes to rest more than 2 meters above the ground is considered unplayable. The disc must be thrown from the ground directly below the disc. Add 1 stroke penalty.
10. A throw that lands out-of-bounds must be played from the point where the disc went out-of-bounds. Add 1 stroke penalty. Water, concrete sidewalks, parking lots, canals, and streets are normal disc golf out-of-bounds.
11. Never throw until the players ahead of you are out of range, and until the fairway is completely clear of spectators and park pedestrians.

12. Be polite and patient in waiting for others to clear your path or skip that hole and play it later.
13. The Ann Morrison Park Putting Basket is for practicing putting only. NEVER throw at the putting basket as if it is a standard course hole.
