Feb 16 – Grape Growing

with Danny Trevett, Manager of Horticultural Care and Maintenance at Esther Simplot Park

Come learn about growing grapes here in Idaho. Danny will cover everything from planting, pruning and harvesting your grapes to how to train your grape vines and handle the challenges of insects and diseases. Grape vines can be a valuable addition to your homestead or a great backyard hobby with delicious results to boot!

Feb 22 – Organic Gardening

Boise Urban Garden School's Organic Gardening Class taught by Naomi Davenport

Get ready for the upcoming growing season! During this two hour workshop you will learn the basics of organic gardening. Topics will include garden planning, plant selection and care, water, and weed and pest management. Feb. 28 – What Makes Trees Tick – An Inside Look at Trees!

Learn how a tree works from top to bottom. Understanding how a tree functions will help you make decisions about the long term health of your trees. This class is an important foundation for the other classes.

March 1 & March 9 – Fruit Tree Pruning

March 22 – Tree Selection & Planting

Choosing a tree requires careful consideration of soil, the environment, and the mature characteristics of the tree. Planting incorrectly is one of the most common reasons for tree failure. Unfortunately, sometimes the problem isn't evident for 10 or more years. Once you've chosen the perfect tree, learn how to ensure the long-term success of the tree.

March 29 – Tree Problems

Learn about some of the most common problems found on trees in the Treasure Valley. We'll cover insects and diseases that affect our trees and also the most common problems people create by incorrect cultural practices. You'll learn to identify the problems and will be given suggestions on how to correct them.

April 5 – Lawn & Irrigation

with Dave Beck, Boise City Lawn Maintenance Specialist & Danny Roop Boise Parks & Rec Irrigation Mechanic

An overview of important topics related to growing a beautiful lawn, including turfgrass growth, physiology, and effective cultivation strategies for different grass types common in Idaho will be covered. Danny Roop will discuss efficient irrigation systems, plus sprinkler maintenance and design. Q&A at the end.

April 12 – Roses & Landscape

with Andrea Wurtz, Master Gardener & Certified Landscape Technician & Toby Norton, Boise Parks & Rec Landscape Architect

This course will cover all the important tasks involved in the care of roses in the Boise area year 'round. From proper pruning techniques to selecting the right plant for the job, we will review the basic steps involved to produce beautiful, healthy roses. You will also gain an understanding of landscape design, including orientation, hydrozones, and proper plant placement. Q&A at the end.
