


**JULIA DAVIS PARK**  
**700 S Capitol Blvd**  
(86 Acre Regional Park)

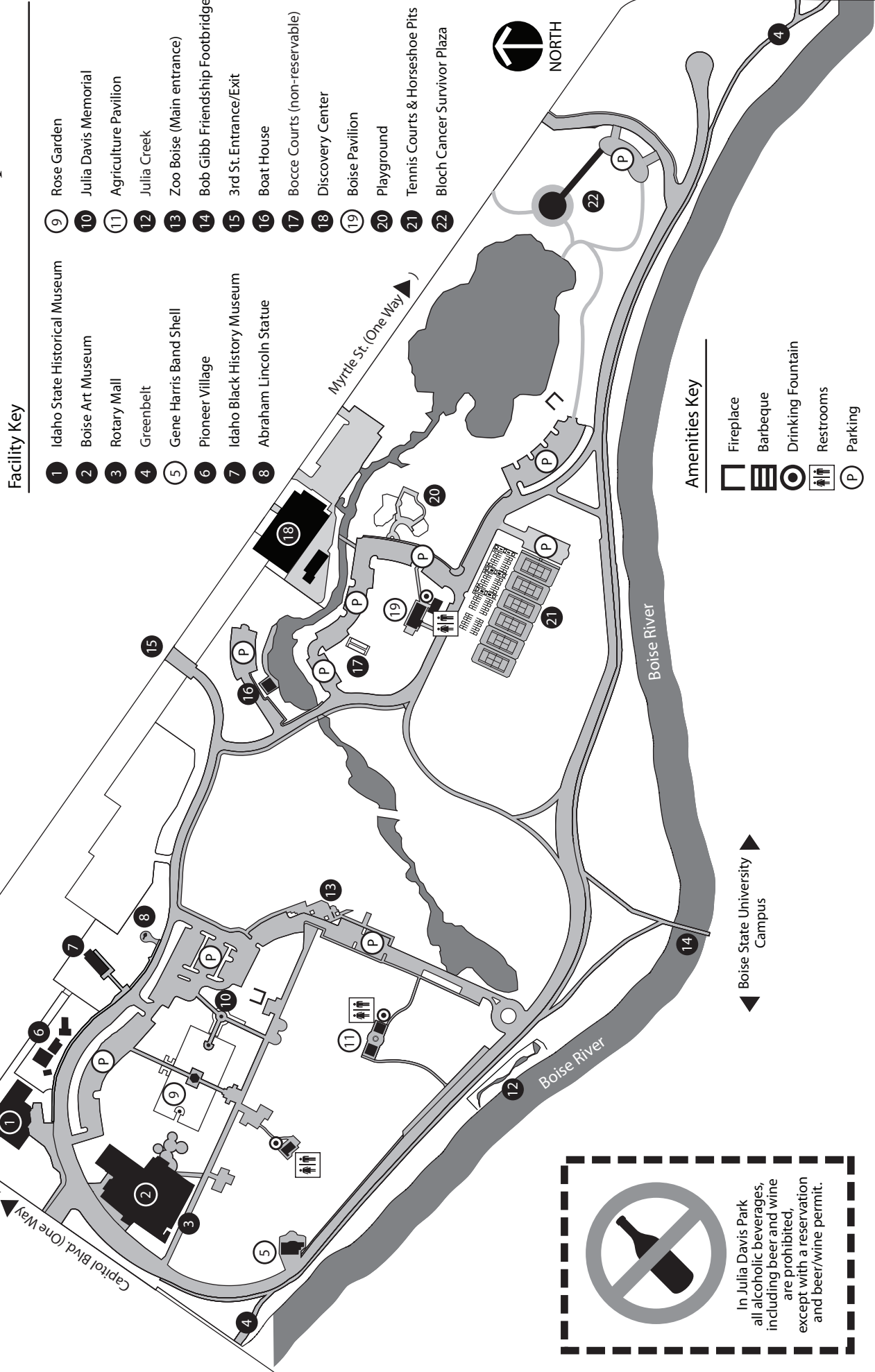
Julia Davis Park is located along the Boise River just south of downtown. The park may be accessed from S. Capitol Blvd on the west and from 3rd Street, south of Myrtle.

**ALCOHOL/PARKING RESTRICTIONS**

- PARK HOURS:** Sunrise to midnight
- RESERVABLE:** Boise Pavilion & Agriculture Pavilion, Rose Garden, Band Shell available for private reservation 2nd Saturday in April through 2nd Sunday in October. Reservation for Special Events available year-round. Reservation blocks: 7a-11a, noon-4p and 5p-sunset
- CAPACITY:** Total park capacity 3500
- FACILITIES:**  
**BOISE PAVILION** - capacity 500/seating 80; thirteen (13) 3'x3' pedestal tables and two (2)-6' serving on concrete slab; Two (2) small grills; Power: Eight (8)-110v outlets, one (1)-220v outlet; with 20 amp breakers; Lighted Facility; Drinking fountain and utility sink  
**AGRICULTURE PAVILION** - capacity 500/seating 73; three (3) 22' rows of picnic benches with eight (8) ADA seating accommodation; double grill; Power: Two (2)-110v outlets (east side - one on each pole); with 20 amp breakers; Drinking fountain by restrooms. Easy access to the Rose Garden, Zoo Boise and the Greenbelt  
**ROSE GARDEN** - capacity 150; ten (10) - 5' benches in gazebo area. **Formal ceremonies only. Chairs are discouraged, but limited to (10) and prohibited on the turf.**  
**BAND SHELL** - capacity 1500; Stage size: Depth; 35', Width; 22' 3" narrowest, 39' 8" widest; Power: Thirty-six (36) 10v outlets and one (1)-220v outlet; 20 amp breakers. Facility lighted by fourteen (14) pole lights and six (6) stage lights. Water; a hose bib under the stage. **Access to behind stage area requires scheduling and Park Staff on duty**  
**ROTARY GRAND PLAZA** – standing event only.
- 
- DOGS:** Dogs are required to have a current license and controlled by a leash, unless otherwise indicated. Leash shall not exceed eight (8) feet in length within 250 feet of the greenbelt. Owners are required to clean up dog waste. Dogs may not harass humans or other animals
- AMENITIES:**  
**AMPLIFIED SOUND PERMIT** - allowed with a reservation at the pavilions/band shell. Only one sound permit is issued per reservation block. Up to five (5) hours may be issued between 7am to 9pm. Fee \$50  
**BBQ** - each pavilion is equipped with BBQ  
**BEER/WINE PERMIT** - allowed at the pavilions with reservation. Fee \$10. Special Events - with reservation, requires Parks Commission approval, fees applicable  
**DRINKING FOUNTAINS** - six (6): Boise Pavilion 1, Agriculture Pavilion 2, Rose Garden, Zoo Boise and throughout the park  
**PLAYGROUND** - Northeast side of park near Boise Pavilion 1; designed for ages 2-5; swing set  
**POWER** - refer to facility listed above for more details  
**RECREATION** - six (6) tennis courts, five (5) may be reserved, otherwise first come, first served basis. Zoo Boise, Boise Art, Historical, and Black History Museums, Paddle Boat House, Discovery Center, Boise River and Greenbelt; sixteen (16) horseshoe pits. Two (2) bocce courts may be reserved, otherwise first come, first served basis. Birding, fishing, statue/memorial and public art  
**TABLES** - picnic benches scattered throughout park for drop in use
- RESTROOMS:**  
**BOISE PAVILION** - three (3) each for women and men. Operated on photo cell, open 2nd Saturday in April through 2nd Sunday in October. Portable restroom provided through the winter  
**AGRICULTURE PAVILION** - four (4) unisex restrooms includes two (2) ADA accessible. Operated on photo cell, lighted and open year-round  
**BETWEEN ROSE GARDEN AND BAND SHELL** - seven (7) for women and two (2) for men. Operated on photo cell, open 2nd Saturday in April through 2nd Sunday in October
- PARKING:** Approximately 491 spaces, includes marked roadside parking throughout the park and 28 ADA accessible spaces. Parking limited to designated areas. **PARKING RESTRICTIONS FROM SEPTEMBER THRU MAY; LIMITED TO TWO (2) HOURS 8a-4p, M-F. VEHICLES PARKED ILLEGALLY, NO PARKING AREAS OR LEFT IN PARK AFTER MIDNIGHT MAY BE TICKETED AND/OR TOWED AT OWNERS' RISK/EXPENSE. - PUBLIC PHONE:** Located inside Zoo Boise, Boathouse, Historical and Art Museums
- ACCESSIBLE AREAS:** Parking, unloading areas, drinking fountain, picnic benches, restrooms, pavilions, playground, open grassy fields, bocce/horseshoe/tennis courts, Boise river, fishing and greenbelt access. Abraham Lincoln Statue, Gene Harris band shell, rose garden, rotary grand plaza, Ricard & Annette Bloch cancer survivor plaza, birding, Childhood cancer pavilion, Zoo, museums, River Node and Discovery Center.
